How to become a Permitted Treating Vet or Permitted Equine Therapist

You wish to become a FEI Permitted Treating Veterinarian?

You wish to attend FEI Events to carry out 'Restricted Therapies' as a Permitted Equine Therapist?

1. Permitted Treating Veterinarian

Step 1: Fill in the application form you can find on the FEI website here: https://inside.fei.org/fei/your-role/veterinarians/education/forms-downloads

Step 2: Send the application form to your National Federation, this is either the Federation of the Country in which you reside or the Country of your Nationality

Step 3: Your National Federation will review your application and can approve your request.

Once your request is approved, you will receive an email from the FEI and/or your National Federation to take the relevant exam on the FEI Campus platform.

Once the exam is passed, you will be listed as a FEI Permitted Treating Veterinarian on the FEI Database.

2. Permitted Equine Therapist

Read the relevant documentation accordingly.

Step 2: Fill in the <u>online application form</u> that is available on the FEI website.

Your National Federation will receive your application directly and will review it accordingly.

Step 3: If your application is approved by your National Federation you will receive an automatic email from the FEI with details on how to take the relevant online test.

Once thee test passed, you will be granted the PET status for 4 years.
